
# **CINDY PARKS**

### A note about the loss of Baker & Taylor

If you are not immersed in the library world, you may not be aware that one of the largest book vendors, Baker & Taylor, has ceased operations. Many libraries relied on this vendor for their collection development because of their ability to give libraries what they needed: a large selection, an easy-to-use interface, curated book lists, discounts, and the ability to process items in the ways each library needed. While we do have other vendors that we use to supplement, Baker & Taylor was our main supplier. So this means we are among the libraries being forced into an abrupt change! This means setting up new accounts, learning new interfaces, connecting our current catalog to different systems, and more! How does all this affect you? Well, this section of the newsletter usually shows you titles based on Baker & Taylor's "Automatically Yours" list. We didn't have to remember to order the latest Patterson, Steel, Grisham, or Johnstone, we just had them on a list of authors to always send us, and they did! Also, when this vendor went down, we had books that had been ordered that are now "backordered" but will never come, so we are actively working to find other ways to get those items we thought we had already ordered. It may take us longer to get some of the newer books and for us to work some kinks out of a new system after decades of using this trusted company that had existed since 1828! Please be patient as we try new things!






On Tuesday November 4th @ 4:30 pm, teens will gather to create treats for our shelter friends!


