Wright will be leading the Navigating Special Education Parental Rights - Series 1 training. Participants will learn their protections under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA). "We will guide you through the basics of these rights, how to use them, and how to collaborate with your child's school team to make informed decisions. Using straightforward language and real-life examples, this session will help you become a confident advocate from the very start." 



